

Hand Hygiene Program Implementation Report August 2019



Introduction

The Hand Hygiene Program was comprehensively launched in 2017 as part of the Ministry of Health's mission to promote safe environment within hospitals. The program has been activated at all governmental hospitals operating under the Ministry of Health (MOH) and at some private hospitals. Since its launch, several processes and activities have been undertaken to enhance its implementation:

- All Hospitals have registered in the World Health Organization's web site.
- An interactive Excel sheet was developed by the General Directorate of Infection Prevention and Control (GDIPC) to collect hand hygiene opportunities and calculate compliance rates. The sheet, which is based on the World Health Organization (WHO) Observation form, was used by all hospitals for monthly between 2017 and 2019.
- In 2019, a web-based platform was developed to collect hand hygiene data from different sources into one user interface and presents stakeholders with useful information.
- Hand Hygiene Self-Assessment Framework (HHSAF) was conducted by the hospitals to obtain a situation analysis of hand hygiene promotion and practices within an individual health-care facility to facilitate development of an action plan. HHSAF was mandated on all hospitals (MOH, Military and Private) on a yearly basis. In 2019, the web-based platform was utilized for the automatic completion of HHSAF.
- Global hand hygiene day is celebrated every year on May 5 to promote the infection control strategies with focus on hand hygiene through series of awareness campaigns targeting healthcare practitioners, patient and visitors in hospitals and in the community.





- In 2018, a long campaign that has lasted 7 weeks was conducted to train more than 120,000 healthcare workers working at both governmental and private healthcare facilities.
- Hand hygiene competency is a mandatory component in the Basic Infection Control Skills License (BICSL) which is required on a yearly basis for all MOH healthcare workers.
- All reports from all hospitals are reviewed to ensure that the quality of the reports meet certain thresholds of acceptability.


This report shows the main implementation processes and activities of the MOH Hand Hygiene Program and the outcomes accomplished so far.



Hand Hygiene Self-Assessment

All hospitals used "WHO Hand Hygiene Self-Assessment Framework" to understand the hospital's level of hand hygiene and track the progress over time. The Framework is a tool with which to obtain a situation analysis of hand hygiene promotion and practices within an individual health-care facility, according to a set of indicators. It also acts as a diagnostic tool, identifying key issues requiring attention and improvement. Repeated use of the Framework will allow documentation of progress with time.

Hand hygiene levels (Advanced: 376-500, Intermediate: 251-376, Basic: 250-126, Inadequate: 0-125) of 382 hospitals are shown in the following graph:



Hand Hygiene Compliance Rate


Measuring compliance with hand hygiene practice is crucial to demonstrating improvements both at a hospital and a national level and ensure a safe care eventually. Hand Hygiene Program monitors the staff's compliance with the five moments of hand hygiene, which are before touching a patient, before clean/aseptic procedure, after touching a patient, after body fluid exposure risk and after touching patient surroundings.

The following table shows the overall hand hygiene compliance rate in each region:










Compliance Rate (CR) in Hospitals per Unit



















Hand Hygiene Activities

- Activation of hand hygiene awareness campaigns global during hand washing day at all MOHs' hospitals in 2018 and 2019.
- Activation of hand hygiene campaigns in the following educational institutions in 2018:
 - Princess Nourah Bint Addul Rhman University, Riyadh
 - King Saud University, Riyadh
 - King Khaled University, Abha
- Measuring the impact of hand hygiene campaigns conducted in 2018 in collaboration with the Impact Measurement Unit at MOH.
- Measuring the effect of different approaches to increase hand hygiene compliance rate in 14 governmental hospitals in Riyadh in collaboration with the Behavioral Economics Unit at MOH.
- Working with Nursing Directorate at MOH to increase hand hygiene compliance among nurses.
- Working with the Armed Forces Medical Services at the Ministry of Defense to implement the Hand Hygiene Program at all military hospitals.
- Conducting several training courses and workshops related to hand hygiene at governmental and non-governmental health facilities.
- Preparing and directing short films or cartoons film in enhancing hand hygiene.
- Contribution to community and school hand hygiene activities.
- Use of social media to increase awareness on hand hygiene.






